



DETER Overpayment Notices

Attention Nevada REALTORS®.

In 2020 many of you filed for unemployment benefits and found you were eligible for PUA benefits. Recently, you may have received emails from the Nevada Department of Employment, Training and Rehabilitation asking to be repaid for the payments made to you. Recently, the Nevada REALTORS® met with DETER to get a better understanding of what the repayment notices mean.

DETER has informed us, that as a result of the Department of Labor's audit, they were being forced to send out about 5,000 of these overpayment letters to Nevadans. Originally, under PUA they were asking for self-attestation of the income received. Now, the Department of Labor is asking that the applicant provide a 1099 or tax return. Many people have ignored this request.

Many of those getting over payment notices have been asked four or more times to provide necessary documentation. For most of the members, if you are getting an over payment notice, this is the situation you are in- you have ***failed to upload*** the requested documentation.

If this has happened to you, we recommend that you go back into your login portal and provide the requested documentation if you haven't already.
